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1 situation where we could have other persons from  
2 non-settling plaintiffs present but not asking questions,  
3 but the questions would be going forward through the liaison  
4 counsel so that way -- and I presume that these interviews  
5 will be -- let me ask. Are they going to be made available?  
6 In other words, not broadcast, but other people can hear  
7 those interviews as they are going on?

8 MR. MORGAN: We have not discussed that.

9 THE COURT: Okay. Why don't you guys discuss that  
10 as another issue because it seems to me that the way I would  
11 envision it, unless the other parties disagree or unless  
12 somebody wants to propose something different, is that  
13 obviously we will have the defense counsel there. We will  
14 have the settling plaintiffs' representative or  
15 representatives there. We have the non-settling liaison  
16 counsel there. We would have potentially one or two other  
17 non-settling plaintiffs' counsel there, but those  
18 non-settling plaintiffs will not be interposing any  
19 questions. The only questions would be coming through the  
20 liaison, not settling plaintiffs counsels' liaison.

21 And then we'd also have to decide in terms of  
22 scheduling how much time is going to be allotted for the  
23 respective interviews, et cetera, et cetera, unless the  
24 parties are in agreement that there will be no time  
25 limitations. It's going to be whatever it is.

1 MR. MORGAN: We've discussed windows for the time,  
2 and so far neither side has had any issues with the windows  
3 we've discussed.

4 THE COURT: All right. So that would be how I  
5 would propose doing it. If there are problems insofar as  
6 selecting who the other non-settling plaintiffs'  
7 representatives would be who would be present at the  
8 interview themselves, then it's something that if you guys  
9 can't settle amongst yourselves, let me know.

10 But conversely, I would also allow -- I would  
11 prefer to have these interviews, not broadcast, but be  
12 available to plaintiffs' counsel who would want to sit and  
13 hear. Although they wouldn't participate, but they would be  
14 allowed to sit and hear what was being said, et cetera,  
15 et cetera.

16 Are these things going to be videotaped?

17 MR. MORGAN: That has not been discussed. They  
18 are going to be recorded. Conceivably, people could  
19 participate by phone but there will also be recordings  
20 available.

21 THE COURT: Yes. I wouldn't say participating by  
22 phone. In other words, they could listen by phone, but they  
23 are not going to be participating by phone.
